Name from the Past: Willie Schultze...living in Boulder and is now on our mailing list. Richard saltmarsh is living in Newport News VA.


We have some info sheets for you this month so be sure to look them over carefully. They do contain information you may well need. You may wish to put these in a safe place for future reference.

See you all then.

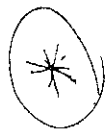

Now for our bad news of the month. Ken Krumpleman lost his Mother. The Sick list for the month is rather overpowering. Charley Kent is in Mercy Hospital. Better News; Bill Bath called while he was in town to say Hello to everyone. He is working with a space project at the Cape in FL. Sounds exciting and we can think of him when those rockets go up.

Gen Joe is heading the Nominating Committee so see him if you want to nominate or run for President at the next meeting which is elections.

SSS or SUPER SERIOUS STUFF In the last Reagan Budget is a proposal to change the COLA's for Federal Annuitants by eliminating the 1990 COLA and beginning in 1991 basing the COLA on the Consumer Price Index minus 1 percent!!! If the CPI is less than 3% a smaller reduction would be made. At age 62 a recomputation of lost buying power would be made and then you would return to the CPI -1% for life.

What this means is that every year you will fall further and further behind in your income from Civil Service and Military pensions. It will also effect SBP benefits as well. One strange thing is VA pensions will not be changed...sounds like they are the only Veterans!

So, to protect your meager pensions we have to be heard in Washington DC. Marie has a friend who was Office Manager for Sen Gale McGee and this is some info she gave us. A form letter counts as one....same with a telegram. Petitions get a slight edge but the most effective communication to DC is the personal letter, it is counted as 5 voters since the sender does care and does have family as well. So fire up your typewriters or pens and let your voice have power. WRITE!!!

Once you do one letter, write another (don't cover two problems in a single letter)

Voice your concern on Public Law 100-360 the Medicare Catastrophic Health Care law.

On the COLA issue, if you cannot write a letter for any reason Western Union has a telegram set-up. For \$6.50 you can get a Mailgram sent to your Senators and Representative in the following manner.

Call 1-800-325-600 and ask for Hotline Operator 40. Tell her you want the Military Coalition's Mailgram sent in your name. From your address she will know who to send them to. These are pre-worded and you have no changes allowed. Western Union will bill your phone for the cost.

I have written one letter on behalf of the Gang (200 strong) and covered all of the Colorado Delegation and Marie and I have both sent personal letters to our own group.

Nearly all retired groups will be able to give you information on this matter so if you need info and can't reach us try them as well.

\* \* \* \* \*

Chuck Whitley says Colorado Pride should ready in June.

Letter Edged in Black - Bill Marlowe passed away in late May.


