porting the mission of the Civil Air Patrol's Colorado Wing consisting of over 2,500 members and gave us a briefing on the Military Status for Colorado Guardsmen. For the Air Guard side the 140<sup>th</sup> Wing has been busy. They passed their ORI inspections while three other units failed and Colorado is the best in the Nation. Recently 223 Air Guardsmen's were deployed overseas and will not be home for the holidays. On a National level it's been a battle with budget details to cut 5% of the ANG force. Talked with the Governor asking for the Council of Governors go to Secretary of Defense with 54 Adjutant General's letters opposing the cuts. The Secretary of the Air force had lost control of the budget now but has gotten back control and it is coming back in favor of the ANG. From the Army Guard side other than some retention problems they are in pretty good shape.

Dewey passed out a list of all the COANG planes and is getting pictures of each that would be suitable for a calendar. He also mentioned to get a calendar put together prices for reproduction and getting orders for 2013 at this date may not be possible. He's thinking a book with pictures and descriptions of each aircraft may be more practical at this time. Next year will allow more time to put out a calendar for 2014.

COANG Air Heritage Museum Committee is continuing to work on the 2000-2009 decade panel.

It was good to see Bill Seiler, who lives in Texas. He mentioned that he and his brother were with General McKinley and on Memorial Day laid a wreath at the Vietnam Wall in honor of Major Clyde Seiler.

Jan Love mentioned she hadn't received any new information on retirees. On November 18, 2012, at 2PM the Wing Commander will have a get together for the family members of deployed troops. December 2, 2012, 9 AM, will be the Wing Christmas Party. Congratulations to Steve Taylor (one of our members) who in his wheelchair wheeled his way across the nation.

The Committee Members met with TREA staff and our group is welcome to meet at their facilities; however they will not have anyone available to cook. To use the kitchen will cost \$200. We can have a potluck if so desire.
